

Antisemite rise in USA

John 4:22 - You Samaritans worship what you do not know; we worship what we do know, for salvation is from the Jews.

Bible – Zech 2:8 – Zion -for whoever touches you touches the apple of his eye

Gen 12:3 - "I will bless those who bless you, and whoever curses you I will curse"

Jer 31:35,36 – “Only if these decrees vanish from my sight,”
declares the Lord, will Israel ever cease being a nation before me.”

Zechariah 14:4, stating, "On that day his feet will stand on the Mount of Olives, east of Jerusalem...". This aligns with Acts 1:11, where angels indicate he will return in the same manner he left.

Rev 7:4 - Then I heard the number of those who were sealed: 144,000 from all the tribes of Israel.

Antisemite - a person who harbors prejudice, hatred, or hostility towards Jews, often manifesting as discrimination, negative stereotypes, or violence.

Antisemitism is considered a form of racism or irrational fear, targeting Jewish people based on their religion, culture, or ethnicity.

Key aspects of antisemitism and the antisemite include:

- **Ideological Beliefs:** Antisemitism can be driven by the false belief that Jews constitute an inferior or dangerous race.
- **Forms of Hatred:** It includes theological hatred, Holocaust denial, racial prejudice, and political attempts to delegitimize the state of Israel.
- **"New Antisemitism":** This concept often refers to anti-Israel sentiments or behaviors that cross the line into de-legitimization of the Jewish state or using antisemitic tropes in criticizing it

Martin Luther's views on Jews shifted dramatically from early tolerance to intense, violent anti-semitism, famously detailed in his 1543 treatise [*On the Jews and Their Lies*](#). He advocated for burning synagogues, destroying homes, confiscating books, banning preaching, and forced labor, describing Jews as "base, whoring people, that is, no people of God".

In *On the Jews and Their Lies*, Luther proposed a "sharp mercy" against the Jewish community, urging:

- **Burning synagogues and schools** to honor God and Christianity.
- **Destroying homes** to force Jews to live under one roof.
- **Confiscating prayer books and Talmudic writings.**
- **Prohibiting rabbis from teaching** under threat of death.
- **Abolishing safe-conduct on highways** to restrict movement.
- **Seizing their silver and gold** and stopping usury.
- **Forcing young, strong Jews into manual labor.**

Hitler, Holocaust – church?

Many Catholic and Protestant leaders initially supported the regime, with some viewing Hitler as a defense against communism. In 1939, German Catholic bishops prayed for Hitler on his birthday, and priests provided support to troops. Following 1945, both major churches in Germany were forced to confront their widespread complicity and silence during the Holocaust.
